Interesting and Offbeat Corvette News

Earlier this month *CorvSport.com* had an article on "10 Impressive Records Set by Corvettes." It included the expected fastest at this and the fastest at that, but there was one that really stood out to me: The fastest average speed over a 5000-mile course. Here's what *CorvSport* had to say:

"In March 1990, the Chevrolet Corvette ZR1 further affirmed its status as 'the King of the Hill' with a series of World Land Speed records. That month, the ZR1 set a new record for the highest 24-hour-5,000-mile land speed with an average speed in excess of 175 mph (282 km/h). It eclipsed the previous 160.2 mph (257.8 km/h) record, which had stood for almost 50 years. That's not all. The ZR1 also set a 5,000-mile average speed record of 173.79 mph (279.68 km/h) and a 5,000 km average speed record of 175.71 mph (282.78 km/h). The ZR1 had launched only a few months before, and the achievements helped solidify Corvette's reputation as a serious challenger, able to compete against established European rivals." WOW! The piece was accompanied by a Car and Driver photo of the car, a rather ordinary-looking C4:
