Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens cruise: On June 7th, five couples braved the weather and headed out to Boothbay and the Gardens: Deans, Kellys, Miniers, Stackpoles, and Billings/Bates. We arrived at the Gardens at 11:15 and hit the café first for a light lunch. It was cafeteria-style with a limited menu, but what they had was unusual and excellent. We left the Gardens at 2:45 and headed over to the Boothbay Craft Brewery for their opening time of 3:00 pm. None of us had been to that brewery/tavern before and were quite amazed at the wide



selection of beers, the unique interior of the tavern (everything was made from reclaimed materials), the food, and the comfortable outside seating. It had been such a pleasant day that we all chatted, ate, and drank until about 5:00 or so before we headed home. A great day!
